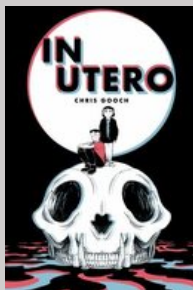

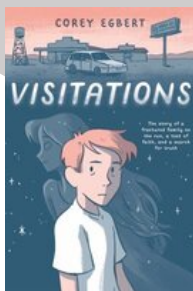


Visitations

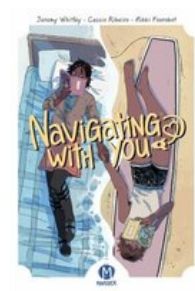
