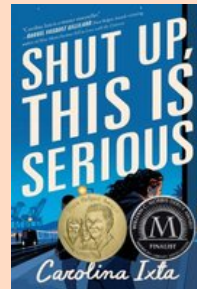


### **Something More** by Jackie Khalilieh
